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How much will the program cost?

There are no fees to you. The Displaced Homemaker Program is funded by federal funds through the Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA).

Eligibility Requirements

- You must have provided unpaid household services for at least two years, have lost your primary source of income, and now find that you must support yourself and your family.
- This can be from any number of personal factors: A separation, a divorce, desertion, a death or a disability of a spouse or partner. If you lose public assistance benefits, you can also qualify.
- You have to meet income guidelines based on a federal formula. Career Solutions staff can help you understand those guidelines.
