Presentation from Resource Training and Solutions – Allison Orgaard, Career and Technical Education Manager

- Orgaard introduced herself and gave an overview of the services provided by their organization. She further explained the various Education Teams that Resource Training and Solutions offers school districts. Orgaard focused on four main programs including:
 - Teacher Externships
 - Mini/Innovation Grants
 - Counselor/Teacher Network
 - SPARK STEM Event
- Resource Training is one of seven Service Cooperatives in the state of MN and serves 60 school districts and Resource has awarded 16 CTE Teaching licenses this summer in just our region.
- Mini Grants were awarded for \$31,691 to 13 applicant School Districts to obtain licensed teachers. Innovation Grants are funded through the Legislative CTE Consortium Grants. MN Legislature awarded Service Cooperatives five million dollars to invest in career and tech-ed in schools to partner with industry. Both Healthcare and Manufacturing are in great demand now.

- CTE Networks provides professional development for Career Counselors in learning what opportunities for students are available in business and industry in our region.
- SPARK STEM event with SCSU and served 700 students in the past years. They are looking to expand to 1,000 this year. Our goal is to expose students to STEM, careers, and hands-on learning opportunities.

Committee Work

- Open House Events: Biery shared that Career Solutions won a Promising Practice Award for Career Solutions Open Houses at the Association Summer Conference. The next Open House will be October 12.
- 2023 CareerONE Video: All can watch our 2023 CareerONE Video at this link: https://youtu.be/W1Nb4eQrT9s
 This has also been shared with donors, youth participants, and their parents.
- Discovery Day Events: Biery explained the programs and dates being offered:
 - CDL is August 16 or October 25
 - Welding December 7
 - XCEL Power-Up Grant September 28
- Grant Updates: Biery shared the following:
 - Pathways for Prosperity (P2P) in Welding was completed and goals were achieved thanks to Felling Trailers. Felling is equipped after the grant to continue to hire from the Hispanic Population in the area.
 - The next P2P Grant will be for Maintenance Technician's that are in demand by many industries. Training includes a boiler license to help participants achieve a credential through the program. Our proposal has been submitted and we should be notified in late November. This proposal involves working with SCTCC and Customized Training.
 - Youth Skills Training Grant was approved for our full request for one hundred thousand dollars to support the Healthcare Track for CareerONE from the Department of Labor. Students will need a work experience component for the training.
 - Xcel Energy Power-Up Grant has been slow to get off the ground, as we were waiting for questions to be answered by DEED and the Part 2 training provider. We are now recruiting for the grant.
- Performance Outcomes SFY23/PY22 Quarter 3: Biery presented on the Performance for Dislocated Worker Program, WIOA, and the Adult Population Program. We have either met or exceeded in all areas. Most of the colored coded numbers on the chart reflect the numbers from Covid period so they may be lower than in the past.
- **2024 Drafted Calendar:** Once all boards approve, we will get meeting announcements out to everyone. We usually meet on the second Monday of the month with a few exceptions. We will bring it to the consent agenda at our next meeting.

From the Floor/Announcements – Borgert asked that the video of CareerONE to be shared with the college. Biery shared that SCTCC will be putting together a Time

Capsule. Career Solutions working with SCTCC to provide data on the number of CareerONE Students who may come back to complete a degree after high school.

Hire a Husky Academy Presentation – Tammison Smith, Associate Director of Career Development and Outreach Career Center, St. Cloud State University

• Smith stated the college is planning on hosting a conference on October 24th, 2023, for recruiters to come and hire students and give advice at Saint Cloud State. There will be about 75 recruiters attending this event. The agenda for the day looks something like this:

- Breakfast in the morning and presentations from different companies covering multiple topics such as Handshake software tips, current trends in recruiting and generations in the workplace.
- In the afternoon they will have lunch and then they will do peer-to-peer sessions with an expert around to give advice.
- Finally at the end of the day, they will head to the hockey arena and have a social hour with the faculty and the deans.

Committee Work

- Felling Trailer Article DEED posted this article on one of their blogs. The
 article recapped the Pathways to Prosperity (P2P) Grant and it talks about how
 Career Solutions trained 23 workers for welding certificates in Sauk Centre. With
 the work that Career Solutions and Felling have done including bringing
 interpreters and working together, Felling Trailers were able to translate their
 materials into Spanish and continue to recruit from the Hispanic community after
 the grant was over.
- WARN Notice: Kent Precision Food Group Announced that their plant will be closing on November 30th, 2023. DEED met with HR and set a date for the 17th of October to do a survey for the employees and if 50 people or more respond, they will turn it into a project. This project will be a separate grant funding for the next 2 years to support those individuals. They are also looking to set up a job fair at the end of the month and assistance to prepare for the job fair like resume review.
- Upcoming Employment & Training Events:
 - Xcel Energy Power Up Program Free Construction/Energy Training Late Fall – This is construction training, and it is a 2-year grant. Career Solutions will be doing the recruiting and some of the soft skills training before turning them over to Building Stronger Communities, which is a union facility that teaches them the basic skills and then they go into the specific training afterwards.
 - Construction Trades Discovery Day Oct 5 9 people attended this discovery day.
 - Fall Job Seekers Open House Oct 12 The Open House includes a variety of activities and workshops such as Resume Tips, Interview Prep and Computer Basics. This will be the first Open House since June because an Open House wasn't offered in the Summer. Career Solutions won the MAWB Summer Conference Award for their work on the Open Houses.
 - CDL (Truck Driving) Discovery Day Oct 25 There is a nice turnout for CDL days so that's why Career Solutions continue to offer these. There is a CDL training provider from Willmar who opened a location in St. Cloud, so Career Solutions sends those people over there to continue the good relationship they have with them.
 - Community Career Labs: English/Somali Fall Schedules The flyer which is written in both English and Somali shows which locations and

what times they will be at those locations. Those locations are CMCEO, Quarryview, and the Islamic Center. Abdul has hours in the career lab so that people from the Somali speaking community can come to the lab in order to get the help that they need.
