


Adult

CareerONE Youth Program

CareerONE is a work readiness program for youth ages 14-17 that started in 2001. Youth learn the process of finding a job, while honing life skills and academic progress. The program has grown from 40 teens to 200. Beyond work readiness skills, youth earn college credits and skills, taking them to in-demand jobs in careers including healthcare, construction and manufacturing, public safety, and early childhood education. Sponsorships, donations, and grants support the program.




