TRAINING GRANTS: DEED / DLI

MN DEED: Minnesota Job Skills Partnership Training (MJSP)

Purpose: Grants awarded to educational institutions with businesses as partners to train new or existing employees, to promote economic development, educational capacity, and provide economic opportunity.

Max. amount: \$400,000

MN DEED: JOB TRAINING INCENTIVE PROGRAM (JTIP)

Purpose: Grants awarded to businesses to help new or expanding employers, adding at least 3 new jobs to Greater MN to train new workers.
